Opinion Piece: How Sand Dams Provide Permanent Water Security

Climate change has had a severe impact on the world's freshwater supply. The United Nations addressed this urgent issue by including water-related issues as the sixth goal of 17 in its 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development released in 2015. It highlighted the global importance of addressing this problem. Unfortunately, by 2030, the demand for water worldwide is projected to exceed sustainable supply by a worrying 40%

Water insecurity is a growing bio-diversity challenge. We must address the problem and arrive at immediate and innovative solutions. While there are numerous solutions, one of the least deployed, but very effective solutions are sand dams.

Sand dams are structures built across seasonal rivers and streams in arid and semi-arid regions to harvest and store water obtained during the rainy season. They capture and store water during the rainy season. This increases the availability of water throughout the year, reducing the dependence on seasonal rainfall and providing permanent water security.



Sand dams are very efficient reservoirs of water. There is no water loss through evaporation and runoff, which are common in arid and semi-arid regions. They are free of human and animal pollution. By storing water in the sand, sand dams help to reduce the loss of water to the atmosphere and increase the amount of water available for use. They also add water to the water table and provide it to the environment.

They are a low-cost solution that requires minimal technology sophistication, with the exception of pump installation, usually a hand pump on a specially designed artisan well. They last for decades without any major refurbishment.

They offer countless benefits to communities in Africa as they provide a reliable source of water for domestic, livestock, and small-scale agriculture use. They reduce the need for women and children to travel long distances in search of water, which can be time-consuming

and sometimes dangerous. With easy access to water a short distance of their homestead, they spend less time collecting water. Immediate benefit is that women finish their house chores early and have more time on other income-generating activities and the children can attend schools in time.

Sand dams, with the sand acting as the water reservoir, naturally filter and purify water, reducing the risk of waterborne diseases. The sand in the dam acts as a natural filter, removing most impurities and contaminants from the water.

Additionally, they help to increase food production by providing water for irrigation and enabling the cultivation of crops and vegetables throughout the dry season. Sand dams recharge groundwater and raise the water table, which can improve soil moisture and fertility, leading to better crop yields. Furthermore, they help to conserve biodiversity by providing a habitat for plants and animals that are adapted to arid and semi-arid conditions.

They have a positive impact on climate change as they provide a reliable source of water during times of drought. The farmer's crops are rain-fed. The sand dams provide water and help to build resilience to climate change in times of drought. This helps improve water security in the long term.

By increasing access to water, sand dams can improve the health and wellbeing of local communities as with access to clean water. The communities are able to maintain better hygiene practices, such as hand washing and sanitation. This helps prevent the spread of disease and illness. In addition, with access to water, communities can grow more nutritious crops, which can improve their income, diets and overall health.

Overall, increasing access to water and sand dams can have a transformative effect on the health and wellbeing of local communities. This leads to improved living conditions, better health outcomes, and greater economic opportunities. The APA Apollo Foundation has built 36 sand dams. All these are built with the participation of local communities and APA Apollo staff. The communities are taught community partnership, improved agriculture practice that helps to build social cohesion and increase community ownership of the project. When the dam is built seedlings of economical beneficial trees are given to the community.

While the challenge remains to secure water security, the future is bright. Sand dams are a highly effective solution to water insecurity caused by climate change. Investing in sand dams is a crucial step towards achieving the UN SDS's, particularly the goal or ensuring access to clean water and sanitation for all by 2030.
